
**Venue: Sindh Agriculture University, Tandojam, Hyderabad**

**Ahsan Danish** presented a scholarly paper on “A Critical Study of the Short Stories of Siraj.”



**Ms. Ghulam Sakeena Veesar** shared a personal reflection titled “Muhanjo Jadugar Mehboob Siraj.”





Under the Learning Network initiative, Project **MEHFOOZ** was launched to address menstrual health and hygiene challenges in underserved rural communities. The project focused on creating awareness and breaking taboos around **menstrual hygiene management**.

A total of 100 women and girls were trained on menstrual health, personal hygiene, and the importance of maintaining dignity during their menstrual cycle. As part of the intervention, dignity kits containing essential hygiene products were distributed among the participants. For many village women, this was their **first exposure** to structured information about personal hygiene, marking a critical step toward improved health, empowerment, and self-care.

The project successfully initiated an open dialogue on a traditionally stigmatized topic, fostering long-term community impact.


In 2024, **Lucky Qindeel Panhwar** and **Sidarat ul Muntaha** were selected to represent IYWO in the **5-day leadership experience**.
